#### **Trust Review of Education**

On Tuesday and Wednesday last week, we had a team from our Academy Trust in school to audit our educational provision in many areas. They watched lessons, looked in books, observed lunch and play times, observed some of our younger children reading with an adult and spoke to the children about their experiences at school. I am really pleased to say that the team agreed with the school judgement that we offer a good standard of education in all aspects with many elements of excellent pastoral support for pupils' personal development. The team saw that we know our children and our community very well and that we provide a range of experiences and support that are well matched to all children's individual needs, especially our children who have a particular special need. The children were really polite and well mannered to the team and they were able to explain their thoughts with confidence - they did us proud!
