Attendance

With your child's Autumn school report, you should all have received a leaflet from school explaining the importance of your child having good school attendance and the negative impact on learning for those children who miss school regularly.

I am going to start to share our school attendance figures with you in each Newsletter and these are the figures for the year to date:

Number of pupils:	Attendance (target 95%+)	Unauthorised Absence	Persistent Absence (less than 90% attendance)	Lateness (pupils arriving after 9.00 am)
w/e 18.11.22	93.9%	1.2%	19.6%	1.2%

Many, many parents and carers work hard to ensure that their children are in school every day and only take time away from school when they absolutely have to - many children have 100% attendance to date which is wonderful. However, the overall percentage of attendance at the moment is less than our 95% target. The most concerning figure is the Persistent Absence figure with almost one fifth of our pupils attending school less than 90% of the time (equivalent to 4 weeks of lost learning in every school year).

I am always monitoring attendance and lateness so I would ask that all parents and carers ensure that children are in school unless they are ill. If your child is ill or has another genuine reason for absence, it is important that you let the office know the reason as soon as possible (on the day is best) as **any absence that is unexplained is recorded as unauthorised.**

Thank you for your ongoing understanding of the importance of good attendance on your child's learning and development.
