Dear parents, carers and families,

This has been another very busy fortnight which has gone by so quickly. I have enjoyed seeing so many of our children enjoying trips out, visitors in school and extra enrichment activities. We have had trips to the local park, a visit to The Eden Project in Cornwall, a journey into space at Plymouth's rocket tour, the start of the mini-police initiative, lots of sports coaches in school, different year groups taking part in Forest school learning with Mrs O'Leary and, this afternoon, Year 6 are at the Theatre Royal watching an amazing play! I don't remember my primary school being so full of great experiences. We held our **MacMillan Bake Sale** last Friday which raised an amazing **£261.50** - just over double what we raised last year. Thank you for supporting this charity event and for those families who made and donated cakes to sell - what a generous community we have.



Who are all these Behaviour Champions?

Since the last newsletter, we have launched a new aspect to our school's Behaviour Framework; the chance for children to be recognised each day as **Behaviour Champions!** We want children to know how proud we are of their efforts to show school values, have positive conduct and try hard to make great choices throughout the day. We also want children to be proud of their fantastic attitudes and have a chance to be recognised for this as they move around the school.

So, in each class, on the board at the front of the classroom, we have added a **behaviour track** so that each child can check if their behaviour is 'on track'. This shows the children's behaviour progress throughout the day with the idea being that all children start each day on the 'start line'. When positive effort and actions are recognised, the children have their name moved along the track. Those that cross the finish line each day get to be the Behaviour Champions the next day, proudly wearing one of our very special Behaviour Champion purple lanyards around school for the day.

Any adult or visitor can recognise a pupil for positive actions, effort or attitude so all children have the opportunity to shine! When adults see great conduct then they simply recognise this by saying to the child that they can 'move themselves along the track'!

The children are absolutely loving this new approach and we have had so many Behaviour Champions so far that I think I will need to order more lanyards!

Of course, we also have our recognition boards in each classroom too, where children's names are added if the go 'above and beyond' showing one of our 6 Keystone Routines:

Wonderful Walking Legendary Lines Marvellous Manners Terrific Transitions Lovely Listening Constantly Kind

So, if your child tells you that they are a Behaviour Champion for the day, this is really something to celebrate. A very well done to all the children who have been a champion so far this term!

EYFS

Year 5



COMMUNITY NEWS

REMINDER - Entitlement to Pupil Premium-Free School Meals

All children in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals as part of the Universal Free School Meals programme. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for additional Pupil Premium funding, if families are on a lower income, to support their child at school. You can apply for this funding at any time during your child's time at Pilgrim Primary..

Children, whose parents are getting any of the following, are entitled to Pupil Premium funding:

• Universal Credit – from 1 April 2018 provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods.

- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and

have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs that does not exceed £16,190).

• Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment you get for a further 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).

• Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right can also get free school meals.

This is the quickest and easiest way to apply and will result in you getting an instant decision. Alternatively, you can email <u>fsm@plymouth.gov.uk.</u>

Remember - Increase In School Meals Prices

Just to make sure everyone is aware, the cost of a school dinner **will rise to £2.80 from 30th October 2023.** Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 are still entitled to a free meal under the Universal Free School Meals scheme.
