











Foundation Stage Information Starting School

Staggered Entry

Your child's individual timetable will include their starting date and time, drop off and collection points.

Youngest children first (depending on individual needs of the child)

Group 1 Morning Morning and stay for lunch All day

Group 2 & 3 Afternoon All day

- We want the children to settle in as quickly as possible
- They have lots of new things to get used to
- We have found in the past that the children get very tired when they start school
- Children have more time in a smaller group to settle into their new environment

Why half days to begin with? My child has been going to nursery full time.

Virtual Home Visits

We will be contacting soon to arrange a virtual home visit with you and your child. Some of you already have this arranged.

In addition to this we would like to have another virtual home visit just before your child starts school.

Why do a home visit?

- This gives your child the opportunity to see us again while in familiar surroundings
- This gives you a chance to ask any further questions you may have

We will contact you early September to arrange this.

Preparing your child for school

Children should be able to...

- ... use the toilet independently
- ·...dress and undress themselves
- ·....feed themselves

How can I prepare my child for school?

First few days...

What happens during the first week of school?

- On your child's first day, we will help them find their coat peg and welcome them into the classroom.
- Activities will be set out for children to do on arrival
- If you or your child is unsettled, there will be an opportunity for you to telephone later 225319.
- At the end of the session, children will be handed over to you.
 Please let us know in advance of any changes in arrangement.

Please - no rucksacks


extra snack if you wish - please look at snack sheet
