What are the School's priorities for 2018 – 19?

Key Priority 1

Further accelerate progress in English (with a particular focus on Writing) in order to raise attainment at the expected and greater depth levels across the school.

Key Priority 2 (2-year plan)

Ensure rates of progress are further accelerated so that the attainment gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupil groups continues to close in all subjects.

Key Priority 3

Ensure that all teachers strengthen pupil acquisition of basic skills, by increasing the breadth of opportunities to practise and apply core subject skills across the curriculum within school and through home learning.

Key Priority 4

Extend the principles and structures of Visible Learning <u>to all subjects</u> to further enable the impact of this to be seen in raised pupil attainment and acceleration of progress across the curriculum from their starting points.

Key Priority 5

Ensure the consistent deployment of high-quality teaching assistants.

Key Priority 6

Continue to accelerate progress in reading and writing with a particular focus on accelerating boys' progress.

Key Priority 7

Ensure a consistent approach to the planning, provision and teaching of number in order to increase progress and attainment, and ensure every opportunity is exploited to develop basic number skills across the setting.

Key Priority 8

Continue to enhance the outdoor environment, to ensure that all areas of learning are represented and there are many opportunities to practise basic skills in the specific areas of Literacy and Maths.

Key Priority 9

To develop greater autonomy and distributed leadership at all levels.

Recent Activities

- Received reports from Subject Leaders on Safeguarding, Early Years Foundation Stage, English, Maths and SEND as part of a rolling programme of all curriculum subjects
- Received reports from the Maths Champion, Safeguarding Champion, SEND Champion, Statutory Grants Champion
- Developed and reviewed the Strategic Impact Plan and identified priorities for school development
- Reviewed the School Self Evaluation Summary (SES)
- Received reports from the Headteacher on the quality of teaching and pupil progress

- Planned a Governor Day when the work of the Governors was reviewed, classes visited, as well as developing an Ofsted Evidence Portfolio.
