They used watercolour wash to create a sunset and then created silhouettes of various scenes throughout the story. In the afternoon, they brought the story to life with music. They were also introduced to a variety of new instruments by some music students from Plymouth University and collaboratively were able to tell the story and create the different moods, settings and sounds mentioned in the story. Years 3 and 4 all came together to perform the complete story which was thoroughly enjoyed by the school house teams.
