


Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to address some concerns raised by a couple of parents regarding a recent article that appeared in the Herald, which some of you might have seen. The article reports data which appears to officially rank Plymouth Schools by a variety of measures. I would like to make it clear that the Plymouth Headteachers do not accept the content of this report as valid. An immediate response was given to the Herald on behalf of all Headteachers and an extract is included below:

...this report offers a distorted view of education across the city...to use 36 out of date measures to produce a league table of 'best', and (by implication) 'worst', is at best unhelpful and worst, destructive...Our hope is that parents will continue to select schools on factors that are important to them. I would be most happy to take you into any one of the schools in the city to witness for yourself some of the amazing work they do.

In the same week, the Herald ran an article about schools with Outstanding Ofsted gradings, with Pilgrim being named as one of them. We continue to do the outstanding work that we have always done to give your children the very best quality of education possible.
