#### **Parent/Carer Consultation Evenings**

Consultation Evenings will be on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> Feb (3.30-5.50pm) and Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb (3.30-4.50pm). These meetings are a chance for you to discuss your child's progress and generally find out how they are getting on at school. I am drawing your attention to these dates well in advance so that we can ensure that as many of you as possible attend these crucial meetings (more details of how and when to book appointments will be sent out at the end of next week).

#### **Parent/Carer Annual Survey**

After half term we will be asking for your feedback to school in the form of our **annual survey** to Parents and Carers. Your opinions and ideas are really important to us and help to shape the future life of the school but the survey can also be a place for you to raise issues that you would like to be better informed about. An example would be, that in the last survey, results showed that some parents/carers were unsure about how we deal effectively with any incidents of bullying. In response to that, we planned an 'Anti-bullying awareness' day in school in November, teaching the children how to recognise the signs of bullying and what to do about it. The older children were taught about remaining safe online and how to deal with online bullying. At school, we teach the children to think of the phrase 'STOP' to help recognise bullying behaviour: actions that are intended to upset or harm 'Several Times On Purpose'. Our Behaviour Policy includes more information about how we deal effectively with bullying behaviour and is available on our website or from the school office. So, please do use the survey to feedback to school – your opinions do really count!

Please also note some new dates of other events coming up which have been added to our Diary section of this newsletter. We are looking forward to more exciting learning in the last two weeks of this half term...where has the time gone?
