Dear Parents and Carers,

I am sure, like me, you have been closely following the news over the last few weeks about the situation in Ukraine. There is no doubt that this is a worrying situation and we have all been saddened to see the impact of the crisis on families and particularly children. Some of our families will be directly affected by the actions taking place in the Ukraine and, as always, we will do everything we can to support them during this time. I have also spoken to many parents on the playground who are concerned that their children are worried about the news stories they are seeing about Ukraine.

In school, we have heard conversations and had some questions raised by children about the crisis in Ukraine. Like other conflicts that are currently taking place in the world, we have not allocated time to specifically discuss the conflict occurring between Ukraine and Russia in curriculum time. We have, however, talked in assembly about children experiencing conflict and our class teachers, who know the children very well, have answered questions in an individual and age appropriate way - I am sure many of you are dealing with some questions from children at home too. In some classes, where children have wanted to get more information, they have watched short clips from Newsround, the news programme specifically for younger children. Please note that there will not be a chance to have in-depth conversations with the teachers during this time as we are still trying to keep everyone Covid safe by keeping social distance and limiting visitors to school. However, I hope it will give you some time with your child looking through their books so that you can celebrate together the progress they have made so far this year.

A few weeks ago, I sent out a short survey requesting some feedback about our current website. Thank you if you responded. The results have been very useful and there are clearly some aspects of the website that you really value such as: Term Dates, information about the curriculum, parent support and wellbeing sections, having access to letters and information about school routines and events.

Curriculum Focus On: English and World Book Week

It was all about English and books in our first week back to school after half term!

The children were welcomed back after half term and greeted with a celebration of their fantastic writing displayed in the corridors. These wonderful published pieces included some poetry from Y2, information texts about crocodiles from Y4 and newspaper reports about Macbeth from Y6. The children are always very proud to see their writing on display.

This week, the children started their English lessons with a 'hook the book' lesson. This is where the children are given a range of clues (objects, pictures, sounds and words) that link to their new focus text. They have to use the reading skill of prediction to predict what their book might be about. This leads to some great oracy discussions, lots of excitement and anticipation as the children always love to find out how the clues relate to the book as they start to read.


World Book Day was last Thursday and we had a day of valuing and sharing books and stories:
